# **HERO IS COMING!**

In 2024 we will be launching our new administration, communication and reporting system, Hero. This is an online sharing platform with complementary smart app.

**Hero** allows schools to customise an online environment that enables teachers, students, and families to view and share content anytime, anywhere on any device. The software is secure, easy to use and brings together all school-related information in one place.

With Hero, you will have the ability to:

- read and comment on posts relating to your child's learning
- view information on your child's progress and goals,
- read school notices sent to the class or groups your child is part of
- view school term dates
- view a school calendar of events
- notify the school if your child is absent or late
- navigate to other school-related webpages
- customise your account by adding a profile image
- select how you wish to receive notifications

Next year Hero will replace Audiri, Sentral and Seesaw as a one-stop communication platform. To prepare for this, we ask parents and carers to please download the app ready for the start of the 2023 school year.

# **STUDENT TRAVEL PASS 2024 – APPLY NOW**



Students who need a new or replacement School Opal card or travel pass for 2024 can apply now. A new application will need to be submitted if they are applying for the first time, or if they are requesting an additional travel entitlement because of a new shared parental arrangement (e.g. joint custody).

Students who change address, school, campus location, have repeated a year or received an expiry notification for their school travel entitlement should renew or update their details

before the end of term 4. This will ensure that schools can endorse applications, and travel passes remain valid for the start of the 2024 school year. School Opal card holders will have the changes applied to their existing card.

If a student's distance eligibility has changed based on their grade (i.e. grade two to grade three), the system will automatically update their entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new eligibility criteria, we will send an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition that is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

Students in the Opal network applying for an Opal card (including a Term Bus Pass) for the first time will receive their Student Opal card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2024. <u>https://transportnsw.info/school-travel-apply</u>

# **BECOME AN ETHICS TEACHER AT MHPS IN 2024**

**Primary Ethics** provides the opportunity for NSW public primary school students who don't attend scripture classes (SRE) to participate in philosophical discussions.



# In order for all Ethics classes to continue at MHPS in 2024, we need more <u>volunteer teachers</u>.

Ethics teachers receive full training by Primary Ethics, the not-for-profit organisation approved to design curriculum and training for the Ethics program. Training consists of short online learning modules and a two-day in-person workshop (or four online classes).

You will learn facilitation and behaviour management techniques that are useful at home and in the workplace too!

As an Ethics teacher, your role will be to facilitate discussion between students. All lesson materials are provided for Ethics teachers by Primary Ethics.

Middle Harbour Ethics classes are currently held on Monday afternoons, 2:30-3pm but that may change next year.
